SPELL CHECK TROUBLE SHOOTING



Troubleshooting Spell Check

With the new spell check feature out to many of you, we figured it would be a good time to do this tip!

Anytime you install FirePro on a new computer, or “stuff happens”, you may need to ensure all the files associated with the spell check are in the correct location.

If you are having problems with the spell check and you have just installed it, make sure you have everything in the right place on each computer (the instructions are in the “read me” file that was in the .zip folder you received or downloaded as well as in the update notes that came out with the FirePro 2 update).

In your firepro folder (which contains your data file <departmentname>.df1), you will need 2 folders called Lang_Lex, and User_Lex.

In the same folder as the file FirePro2.lbs or Firepro2 file you will also need a file called OSPELL2.CFG. This is usually also in your FirePro folder. This file is automatically created by FirePro – it is not a file that comes with spell check. So, unless something is wrong, you don't need to think about it!

No suggested words?

If you are using spell check and it stops on every word with no suggestions, close FirePro 2. Delete the file OSPELL2.CFG and restart FirePro. Once FirePro restarts the file you deleted will be re-created. If this still doesn't work then let us know.

Doesn't identify misspelled words?

If when you try to check spelling it doesn't ever stop on any word and you know it should, the file ospell2.dll is probably not in the right place on that computer. On every computer that is running FirePro you will need to copy the file ospell2.dll from your FirePro folder, and paste it into, C:\Program Files\RainingData\OS42 RT\xcomp.
